Tuition and Fees	UFABC is a public university funded by the Federal Government of Brazil, free of any charges for all study levels.
Language Requirements	No specific proof of language test is required, but the Home Institution must issue a statement attesting the student has a good command of English, equivalent to B2. The same command of Portuguese language is also required if the student intends to enroll in Portuguese-taught courses, which are the majority offered.
Academic Calendar and Periods.	UFABC is divided in three terms per year: 1 <sup>st</sup> term: February to April. 2 <sup>nd</sup> term: mid-May to August. 3 <sup>rd</sup> term: September to December. Consult the <a href="#">undergraduate</a> and <a href="#">graduate</a> academic calendar.
Course Catalogue	The courses catalogue usually updates 60 days before the start of the upcoming quarter. Students may have to submit their application based on the previous year's catalogue and it may not be possible to guarantee that all courses shown for the previous quarter will be running in their current quarter of study. Most courses are offered in Portuguese, and courses offered in English will be informed on the same catalogue. Access the undergraduate <a href="#">previous catalogue courses offered at UFABC</a> .
Accommodation	UFABC does not provide student housing, however we suggest some options for websites for search: - Facebook Groups: " <a href="#">Morar UFABC</a> " & " <a href="#">Repúblicas UFABC</a> "; - <a href="#">Airbnb</a> ; - <a href="#">Roomgo</a> ; - <a href="#">Webquarto website</a> (for single rooms); - Hostels: there are no certified hostels in Santo André or São Bernardo do Campo, but there are plenty in São Paulo close to

	<p>subway, which makes it easy to reach Santo André by train. We suggest either one of two hostels that are part of Hostelling International. One of them is Praça da Árvore Hostel, close to Praça da Árvore subway station. You can make reservations on their website (in English). The other one is Pousada dos franceses, close to Avenida Paulista, and you can make reservations on their website (in English) and find more information about it.</p>
Study Visa	<p>The visa must be obtained BEFORE the student's entrance in Brazil at any Brazilian consulate. All the students must get a special type of visa called <b>TEMPORARY VISA ITEM IV</b> to be able to enter in Brazil. The Brazilian Consulate within your area of jurisdiction will require you to fill out <a href="#">a visa application form</a> to obtain a student visa type IV.</p> <p>After you apply for your student visa and receive it, do not forget to bring your original and copy of the approved visa application form and your original birth certificate with you to Brazil. You will need it to register your visa at the Federal Police Department within 90 days of your arrival (be aware that this period starts to count from the date of your arrival in Brazil, and not the beginning classes date). To apply for the visa, students might be required to provide proof of sufficient funds for their stay in Brazil. The Brazilian government does not request proof of a specific amount of money.</p> <p>Foreign researchers must apply for and obtain a Type I visa in order to carry out postdoctoral activities in Brazil.</p>
Cost of living	<p>The expected cost of living in the ABC region is between USD400 and USD600 per month, depending on the type of accommodation and life style.</p>

Application Procedure	<p>Undergraduate students must fill in our <a href="#">application form</a> and submit it at the university's international office or responsible department for stamp and signature. The form must be forwarded to <a href="mailto:incoming@ufabc.edu.br">incoming@ufabc.edu.br</a> along with the copy of passport, student transcript of records, and a copy of the International Travel / Health Insurance policy, according to specific requirements (please <a href="#">visit our website</a> for further information). Graduate students must have a supervisor at UFABC who will be responsible for the required <a href="#">documentation</a>.
